## Arts & Culture

### 1 Visit the Royal Pavilion

The Royal Pavilion dates back to 1787 and is a former royal residence. Built in the Indo-Saracenic style prevalent in India for most of the 19<sup>th</sup> century, the Pavilion originally belonged to the Prince Regent George IV.

Join our EF group tours or take a stroll through the beautiful Pavilion Gardens. The gardens often play host to live musicians so enjoy the music and arrange a friendly picnic in the summer sun.



### 2. Discover the Street Art and Graffiti in North Laine

Brighton is an artistic city and one of its many wonders is the North Laine Street Art. Make sure you visit Trafalgar Lane in particular.

Go for a walk and photograph your favourites. The graffiti is changed on a regular basis so make sure to return to these streets to see the new artwork.

A famous work of graffiti by Banksy can be found alongside an impressive mural on the side of the Prince George pub under Brighton train station.



### 3. Explore Marine Life at the Sea Life Centre

The Brighton Sea Life Centre is the oldest operating aquarium in the world. Experience marine life, including sharks and giant turtles or take a ride on the UK's first glass bottom boat.

The Sea Life Centre is part of Brighton's cultural heritage.





## 4. Visit the Brighton Museum & Art Gallery

Located in the Royal Pavilion Gardens, the Brighton Museum and Art Gallery boasts a diverse collection of art and history about the city.

Join EF Activities for a visit here with other students.



## 5. Go to The Booth Museum of Natural History

Founded as a Victorian collector's private museum, the Booth Museum brings natural history to life with interactive displays and hands on activities. Come and view the fossils, birds, butterflies and bones. And it is even free to visit.



## 6. Return to innocence at the Brighton Toy & Model Museum

Brighton's Toy & Model Museum is located below Brighton station within the four Victorian Arches. It was founded in 1991 and today holds 10,000 models and toys. Pop in for nostalgic treat!



## 7. Browse the Art Galleries along the Seafront

Art and culture can also be found along the seafront in its many small boutiques. Brighton's charm comes from the many creative people living here and along the seafront they display their talents. Make sure to soak in the Brighton spirit!

### 8. Catch a Comedy Show at Komedia

Komedia is situated in the North Laine. It is a cinema, theatre, cabaret, music and night club venue. If you enjoy stand-up comedy, live music, new movie releases or if you simply like to go out dancing – this is the place for you!



### 9. Be entertained at the Brighton Dome

Brighton Dome is a multi-arts venue that every year present and produce 600 events spanning music, theatre, dance, poetry, spoken word, visual arts, film, digital and more. With a 200-year-long history, it is truly one of Brighton's most important centres of creativity.



### 10. Take part in the live music scene

Brighton is well known for its music scene and many concert venues. But every night in hundreds of pubs and restaurants, the city comes alive with open mic nights and live music performances! Many famous bands originated in this city. Perhaps you will find the next big thing in one of the city's local pubs?





## 11. Enjoy a day at the Palace Pier

Enjoy being outdoors? Holding on to an ice cream or coffee and hanging out with friends? Then a day at the Pier is a good choice!

For a small sum you can get the all-inclusive wristband that enables you to take part in all the attractions for the whole day. You can also gamble, play Guitar Hero or play air hockey in the indoor dome. Not to mention munch on Churros and cotton candy to your heart's delight!



## 12. Catch a movie at the big screen on the beach






## 14. Get frightened on the Ghost Walk of The Lanes!


## 18. Go for a shopping-spree at Churchill Square

For more cheap clothing you can go to Primark on Western Road near Churchill Square the store for everything from handbags to clothing to home décor.

## 30. Learn to windsurf at Hove Lagoon


Close to the EF Residence there is a windsurfing centre focused on beginners and intermediate surfers.

Press the accelerator and don't look back...






### 33. Bike or hike to Devil's Dyke

A new trendy water sports activity is the standing paddleboard.


Test your balance and paddle along the seafront – a very fun way of enjoying a day at the beach!

Chalk hosts both regular weekly club nights and live music events. They play a variety of styles but mostly pop, disco and indie music. Why not pop in on a Saturday night?


## 74. Go dancing to swing music at The Mesmerist

Both the EF school and the Residence are located close to the sea. Why not bring your swimming clothes and head down after class? It is also a very good exercise option if you do not fancy the gym.




## 79. Enjoy some doughnuts or churros at the Pier

## 94. St Ann's Well Garden Spring Festival #May

St. Ann's Well Gardens is a park in Hove. The park is renowned for its chalybeate spring, which is named St. Ann's Well. On one day in the middle of every May there is a Spring Festival to raise money in order to preserve the park. Why not help them save the wildlife?





## 95. Naked Bike Ride #June

Every June Brighton takes part in the World's Naked Bike Ride in order to celebrate cycling and the human body.

## 98. Get spooked at The Brighton Zombie Parade #October

The walk starts near the West Pier (definitely haunted!) and then they stumble, moan and groan their way through the city centre on their way to Madeira Drive, finishing at Concorde 2 for an after-party

## 99. Lewes Bonfire Night #November



Bonfire Night is an annual event dedicated to bonfires, fireworks and celebrations. In the UK it is also known as Guy Fawkes Night.

Make sure to go to Lewes to join the UK's largest and most famous Bonfire Night. With Lewes being called the Bonfire capital of the world; 3,000 take part in the festivities and 80,000 come to experience the event.

## 100. The Burning of the Clocks/ Winter Solstice #December



This celebration is based on a procession of lanterns and costumes, led by local bands. The procession makes its way through Brighton city centre to the seafront where the festivities culminate in a lantern bonfire, accompanied by fireworks. The costumes all include a clock face to represent the passing of time.
